So, when our body gives us the signal – stomach in a knot, or tremendous joy flooding into our lives – follow the body's signals. Pray for the person or the situation concerned. You can be sure that your prayer will be authentic.



#### 1<sup>ST</sup> HOLY COMMUNION

In his homily to the children, Father Thomas talked about **patron saints**, more specifically the two (that's right—two) patron saints of First Communion. They are St Tarsicius, a 3<sup>rd</sup> century Roman altar boy who was martyred on the way to give Holy Communion to imprisoned Christians awaiting martydom and Blessed Imelda Lambertini, a 14<sup>th</sup> century 11 year old Italian girl. Blessed Imelda was born into a devout family and entered a convent at the very young age of 9. She strongly desired to receive Jesus, however, she was too young. After Mass, she stayed back and when the nuns were looking for her, they found her kneeling with a glowing light suspended above her and inside the light was the Sacred Host. The priest realized that she was to receive the sacrament and once she did, she joined Jesus.

"Take this all of you and eat it for this is my Body which will be given up for you," and

"Take this all of you and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, it will be poured out for you and many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me."

When asked if there is anywhere they have heard these words the majority of the children said – "at church!" Pictures were then shown of this part of the mass and it was explained how, when the Priest prays over and holds up the bread and wine, they are changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. Encourage your children to look out for these moments in the mass. A clue that this special moment is happening is to listen for the bells to be rung!
