REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Our religious tradition is founded on love. Actually, life itself is grounded in love. We may not always feel this love, but if we allow ourselves to reflect on life, we will realise this truth. We have been called into being by God's love; and we will only be happy if we live in



that love. Thus, when we are directed to love God and love one another, we are not being asked to do something contrary to our nature. Rather, we are being told to live in accord with that nature. We come from God who is love, and so it is in our very nature to love and to be loved. We may sometimes think that it is easier to love God than to love others. It may actually be just the opposite. Other people are tangible. We can see and hear them, interact with them. Their influence in our lives can permeate our consciousness. That is not the way it is with God. Like Moses on the mountain, we can only see the traces of divinity as God passes by (see Ex 33:23). However, we show that we love God in the way we love our neighbour.

Love, the foundation of the reign of God, is contagious. When we love others, the reign of God spreads throughout the world. The compassion that we show toward others is a form of evangelisation. It proclaims much louder than any words that the reign of God has been established.

This summary is about Children's Liturgy from 2 weeks ago.

Children's Liturgy Last week, the children listened to a parable about a king who invited many different people to his son's wedding. Initially, invited guests refuse the invitation. After facing consequences, the king invites all. We discussed what God is inviting us to do, and the children gave some beautiful answers. 'God is inviting us to love our neighbour' 'God is inviting us to love our family.' 'God is inviting us to love our parents'. The children then reflected on their everyday life, how they prepare when they are invited to a birthday party eg. Accept the invitation, buy a present, and write in the card, and then found similarities with how we can accept God's invitation and follow his word. We discussed how sometimes it isn't always easy to accept God's invitation, but if we are prepared, it is easier for us
