
A new year is on the way and the possibilities are endless. May this year bring happiness and many new inspirations to your life.

#### **POPE FRANCIS:- YEAR OF PRAYER 2024**

Pope Francis has proposed that 2024 should be marked as a year dedicated to prayer. This is in preparation for the Jubilee in 2025 "Pilgrims of Hope" and dioceses are invited to promote initiatives to remind people of the centrality of both individual prayer and community prayer. Pope Francis stated on November 15 that prayer should be marked with simplicity in accordance with the heart of Christ and also added that prayers should be made of words from the heart. Each of us is called on to reflect on what we pray, how we pray and why we pray. We are encouraged not only to strengthen our prayer lives but to encourage other to rediscover the importance of prayer in 2024.
