Dear Parishioners

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Riverview

It was just over four years ago, that I penned an open letter, advising you that Fr. Joji and members of the Parish Finance Committee and Parish Council had commenced discussing a redevelopment proposal for the site on which Our Lady Of Perpetual Help Church at Riverview now stands.

Much has changed since then. Following many meetings, prayer, thought and more than just a few sleepless nights, the Parish and College came to the shared understanding that our beloved church was more than able to continue to exist and to coexist with the expansion plans that St Peter Claver College are aspiring to achieve. As you already know, the fate of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church continues to rest in our hands and that, in permitting the College to expand, the Parish is to yield up to the College, the major portion of the Parish's land that surrounds the Church.

Unfortunately, for all of this time, little maintenance has been done to the Church. Consequently, our beloved Church has deteriorated into a poor state of repair. This is something that has continued to weigh heavily upon Fr. Thomas, myself and many members of our community.

For some time now, work has been going on behind the scenes to enact a plan to repair the Church. I am more than happy to announce now that the Archbishop has approved funding for the repair of the Church. This is the ultimate canonical approval required to commence this work.

Repairs will include replacing the roof, repairing and re-cladding external walls and fascias and renovating the sacristy. If it can be achieved, the main entrance to the Church will be repositioned into the southern, glass panel wall and the existing door replaced with solid glass panels.

In time, it is then hoped that the residual land around the Church will be given a makeover.

Especially those parishioners who regularly attend mass at Our Lady of Perpetual Help will have noticed that some temporary fencing panels have been set up in the car parking area outside the main entrance. This has been done in preparation for storing the roofing materials on site ahead of and during that phase of the repairs.

The principal contractor will be Mr. Tim Habermann. Tim and his wife Janet, are parishioners and Tim was the principal contractor for the renovations at Sacred Heart Parish.

Contracts are yet to be finalised and this will be done in the next few weeks. However, it is anticipated that renovations will commence during the month of September.

As with the renovations of Sacred Heart Church, Our Lady of Perpetual Help will become a building site, subject to the occupational health and safety requirements of such. We can reasonably expect to have the church enclosed in safety fences and scaffolding as well as restrictions to control the number of access points into the Church. Needless to say, it is intended that mass will continue to be said at its regular time on Sunday morning, unless it becomes absolutely certain that it cannot.

Over the coming weeks, Fr. Thomas and I will aim to update you with relevant information as it comes to hand.

REFLECTION


In the Western church this feast celebrates the assumption of Mary into heaven; in the East it commemorates her dormition or her falling asleep. The readings invite us to reflect on the role that she plays in the mystery of our redemption. Whatever we honour in Mary in some way points to her son.

Over the centuries devotion to Mary has been expressed in forms taken from the culture out of which it developed. Sometimes she is pictured as a humble peasant girl. At other times she is depicted as a queen robed in gold of Ophir who rules from heaven. Probably the most familiar pose is that of a mother with her child. Perhaps the most dramatic of these themes is that of the celestial woman from the vision found in the Book of Revelation. It is because of the cosmic significance of Jesus that this tradition has been applied to Mary.

Though the first reading depicts a cosmic woman, the gospel reading characterises Mary as a simple peasant woman intent on offering service to another. However, the words that are placed in her mouth are words of prophetic challenge. She announces the great reversals of God's good news. The greatness of Mary is a reflection of the greatness of the Son of God whom she bore. He was the first fruits of salvation. He was the victor who won the kingdom. Her part in this victory was to bring him to birth and into maturity.
